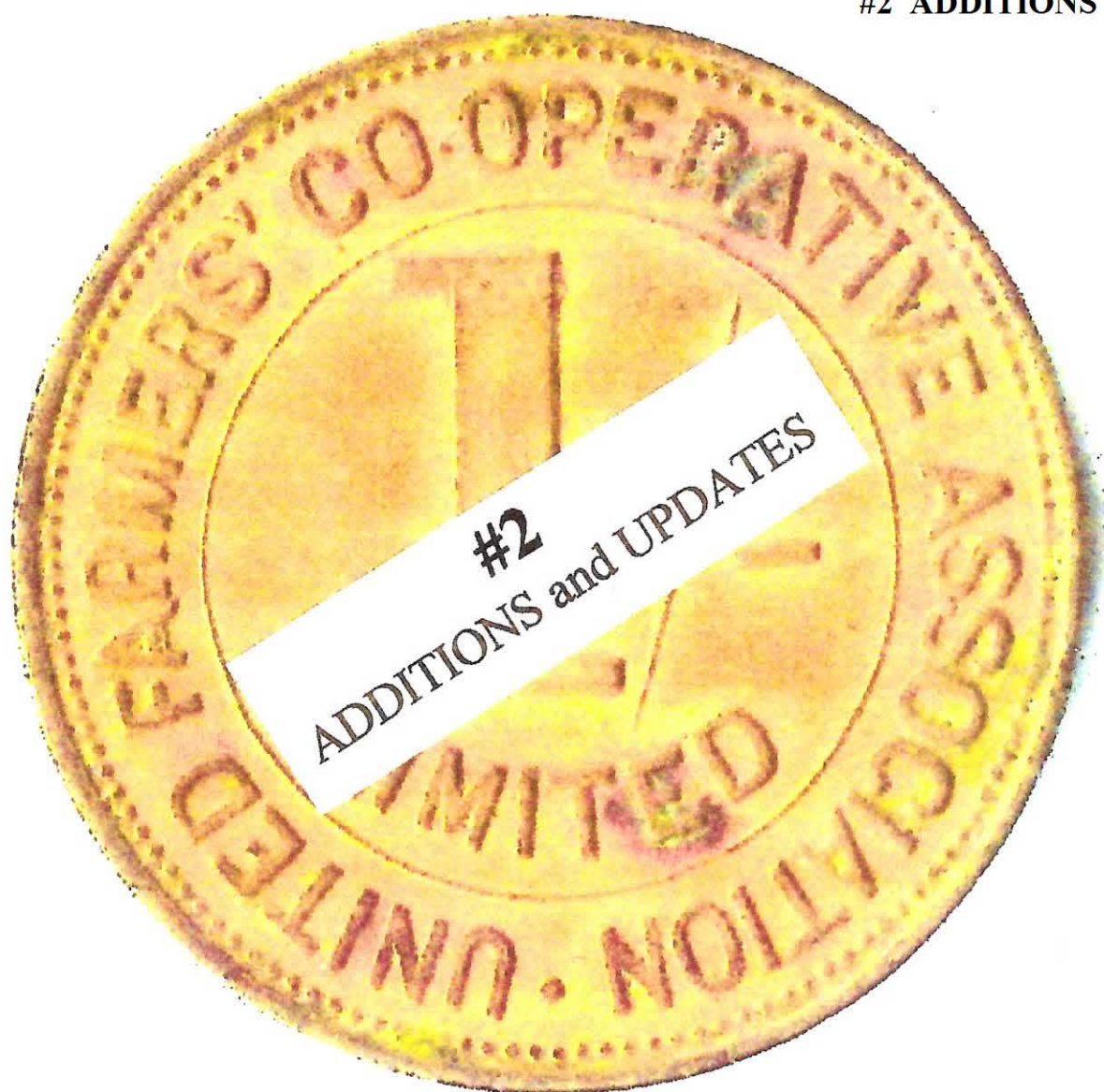

RIVIERA PRINCIPALITY

Description

It was founded in 1996 in Marlborough, a region located in the northeast of the South Island of New Zealand. It was established with the intention of creating the N.Z. equivalent of Australia's Hutt River Province Principality. The ambitious principality comprised a market centre, boutique brewery, wine shop, conference centre and tavern. However, the Riviera Principality no longer exists as such, having failed to overcome a number of obstacles in the way of Prince MacDonald's ambitious project. The coinage issued by the short-lived Principality is very scarce and it is not easy to obtain.

The Riviera Principality was a short-lived state that was in existence from 1996 until 1998, when it ceased to exist, due to bankruptcy.

The Riviera Principality was located in the Marlborough region near Blenheim at the top of New Zealand's South Island.

Some of the coins have turned up, but very few notes have ever turned up - making them extremely rare.

These are the first plastic banknotes that were ever put into circulation anywhere in New Zealand.

In poker, the value of a chip depends on the game or event. Values in cash games are used as a direct representation of cash.



Composite/Clay Chips

At one time, poker chips were made of clay and had a much better feel than cheap plastic chips. However, modern chips are not made of clay, but a composite material meant to mimic the touch and feel of those style of chips. Clay chips were standard in saloons and card rooms in the 1800s but haven't been used since the 1950s. They were replaced by clay composite because they're more durable and not brittle like the old clay chips.

Most chips come in traditional 11.5, or 13.5-^{gram}ounce weights and make for an excellent game. They stack and riffle easily, are easy to slide along the table felt, and are indeed long lasting. Their heavier weight than the old plastic ones makes chip tricks easier and produce a deeper sound when splashing a pot.

With the growth of the game over the last two decades, these types of composite chips can be purchased easily online and even in some retail stores. They are relatively inexpensive with sets of 300 chip starting around \$35. Those looking for a decent chipset that functions well would do well to purchase some of these.

Ceramic Chips

A step up from composite and clay chips, ceramic chips have a smoother surface, better quality, and a harder durability. Ceramic chips are manufactured using injection moulding, and graphics are printed directly on the chip as opposed to an inlay or sticker used in lesser-quality chips. Because of this, ceramic chips are much more customisable with more elaborate designs.

Featherston, NZ – POW Camp



The following tokens, were issued by N.Z. Govt. 1/2, and 1 penny, 3, and 6 pence, and 1 and 2 shillings. These were the first tokens to be used, before the Australian ones were used.

During WWI, Featherston was the largest military training camp in New Zealand, housing 7500 men. It was dismantled after the war ended. In September 1942, the US requested that it be re-opened as a prisoner of war camp for the captured Japanese troops of Guadalcanal.

Approximately 900 Japanese and Korean men were housed in the camp with the senior Japanese officer being Lt. S. Kamikubo of the Imperial Japanese Navy. The prisoners consisted of Koreans and labor units who had worked on Henderson Field and about 250 Japanese, at the time of the POW uprising. Lt.Colonel D.H. Donaldson was the camp's commandant.

The Japanese prisoners were from the army, navy and air force with the majority of them from the cruiser IJN *Furutaka*, which was sunk during the Battle of Cape Esperance. The remaining 19 men were the extent of the surviving crew from the destroyer, *Akatsuki*. It was this group that refused to assist in the work parties and staged a sit-in on 22 February 1943.



A guard fired a warning shot, which appeared to have injured Lt. Adachi Toshio. This led to an apparent charge by 250 rock-throwing prisoners. The guards opened fire with rifles and sub-machine-guns. Forty-eight POWs and one New Zealand guard were killed.

An official inquiry cleared the guards of wrongdoing by judging that they acted in self-defense. It blamed the incident on cultural differences worsened by a language barrier.

Among the issues was the Japanese being unaware that under the 1929 Geneva Convention, compulsory work by the prisoners was allowed. The Japanese government rejected the court's findings.

In September 1945, the prisoners told a neutral inspector that they were concerned about repatriation as honorable citizens; provisions would be necessary or they should be given asylum on a Pacific island. They feared a mass suicide might result otherwise. The POWs also worried about the treatment in New Zealand when news of the conditions in the Japanese POW camps holding their men was released. **1057**

**P.O.W. Camp Riot:
48 Japs Killed**
—Forty-eight Japanese were killed or their last of wounds and 61 were wounded in a riot that broke out in a prison camp.



The prisoners were transported in two trains from Featherston to Wellington and embarked on 30 December upon two large American tank landing vessels, LST 273 and LST 275, under Lt.Comdr, R.P. Rudolph, for Japan.

The Featherston uprising would inadvertently be one of the reasons for the Cowra POW camp incident in August 1944, to be posted later in this series.

The Featherston POW Camp was located about 125 miles from Wellington New Zealand. The camp housed Japanese POWs mostly captured at Guadalcanal. The camp was the site of a prison riot in which 13 POWs and 1 guard was killed. The tokens are made of steel and are uniface and rusted easily. Denominations of 1/2, and 1 penny, 3, and 6 pence, and 1 and 2 shillings. All of the Featherston tokens are extremely rare.

PRISONER OF WAR AND INTERNEE CAMPS - MONEY TOKENS

Your memorandum 3239/41/1659 of 22/7/1942 has reference to the Army proposal for the supply of metal tokens for use as currency in Prisoner of War and Internee Camps.

2. The tokens have been minted and are in use in P.O.W. and Internee Camps in Australia.

3. A memorandum in the following terms has now been received from the Department of the Army :-

"New Zealand Liaison Office desire to know whether it will be necessary for the New Zealand Government to approach the Commonwealth Government with a view to obtaining release of the undermentioned tokens for use in New Zealand prisoner of war camps.

It is not possible to release the above quantities from existing stocks. Providing approval is granted every facility will be afforded the Dominion of New Zealand by loaning dies and assisting to complete arrangements with the contractors."

Australian currency was prohibited inside the camps and the first medium of exchange used therein was a series of currency notes produced inside the camp in 1941. The denominations printed were 6d, 1/- and 2/- but the issue of these notes contravened Australian law and they were withdrawn in favour of tokens issued by and on behalf of the Australian Defence Canteen Service from September 1941 onwards. The Internment Camp Tokens were struck by private contractors in Victoria and were also used in New Zealand. They were withdrawn at the end of the war and exchanged for Australian legal tender coins and notes. Nevertheless a few were souvenired by the inmates and/or guards and so are available to collectors today. The 5/- token is by far the scarcest and estimates put the number in existence below 100 specimens. This means they are much rarer than the 1930 penny.

New Plymouth was once the smallest municipality in the world to have an overhead electric tram service

In 1916 there were six electric trams in New Plymouth running from Fitzroy to the port and from Elliot St to Morley St. New Plymouth had become the smallest municipality in the world to run an overhead electric tram service.

It seems pretty insignificant to us today, but back in 1921 it was a huge leap forward in the city's transport system. One more tram (number 10) was put into operation in 1925.

The City Council was very proud of its electric tram fleet and proudly displayed the city's coat of arms and New Plymouth in large letters on each side.

Three thousand people lined the streets on July 24, 1954 (the day I was born), outside the old Criterion Hotel to see off the old trams, the Mayor delivering a heart-rending speech from the balcony and free rides were offered after 7pm until 9pm.

Packed to the gunnels, the old trams moved off through Devon St with three local bands playing; The City of New Plymouth Highland Pipe Band, the New Plymouth Caledonian Band and the New Plymouth Municipal Band. What great days!

Can you imagine that even happening today when a new fleet of buses took over the old? People wouldn't give it a second thought I bet! How times have changed.

By all accounts as the last tram turned into Devon St on its homeward run, the New Plymouth Municipal Band marched in front of it, leading the tram through the cheering crowd who were standing right across to the middle of the road, throwing streamers and clapping.

History

Washworld Te Rapa opened in Hamilton at the beginning of 1996, joining four other Auckland Washworld locations. Washworld were the pioneers of self service car washing in New Zealand, opening the first car wash at St Lukes, Auckland in 1984.

Washworld Te Rapa changed hands in September 1999 and is still owned and operated by the same local business operators, Jeff and Kelly Olsen.

In 2005 Washworld Te Rapa underwent a \$500,000 upgrade with the addition of a new building housing two self serve dog wash tubs and the conversion of one of the self serve washbays to a Touchfree Automatic carwash machine. This also included the installation of the first car wash pay station in New Zealand able to process credit card payments.

Two further New Zealand "firsts" were added in 2010 in the form of a new "Air Blade" self serve dryer designed to strip water from vehicle surfaces including motorbikes and dry floor mats. The second addition was a cashless payment system called WashKey using a microchip embedded in a plastic key preloaded with credit that activates wash equipment by simply being turned on.

2011 saw another NZ first with the addition of Pet fragrance machines added to our dog washes which have proven very popular.

2015 has seen the addition of just the second ProTouch Tandem brush Automatic car wash in New Zealand and the first to include "Overglow" Carnauba wax. The closed cell foam and light touch brush action offers a safe, gentle non scratch clean. The Ultimate wash package also includes a tri colour polish and buff cycle, final Spot Free rinse and "Flashdry" which results in an unmatched clean, shiny and dry car.

Did you know we use over 200 litres of dog shampoo, more than 1200 litres of car wash detergent and 7 million litres of water per year. We collect around 30 tonnes of solid waste made up of dirt, oil, grease or toxic metals and chemicals from such things as brake dust, exhaust gases and detergents.

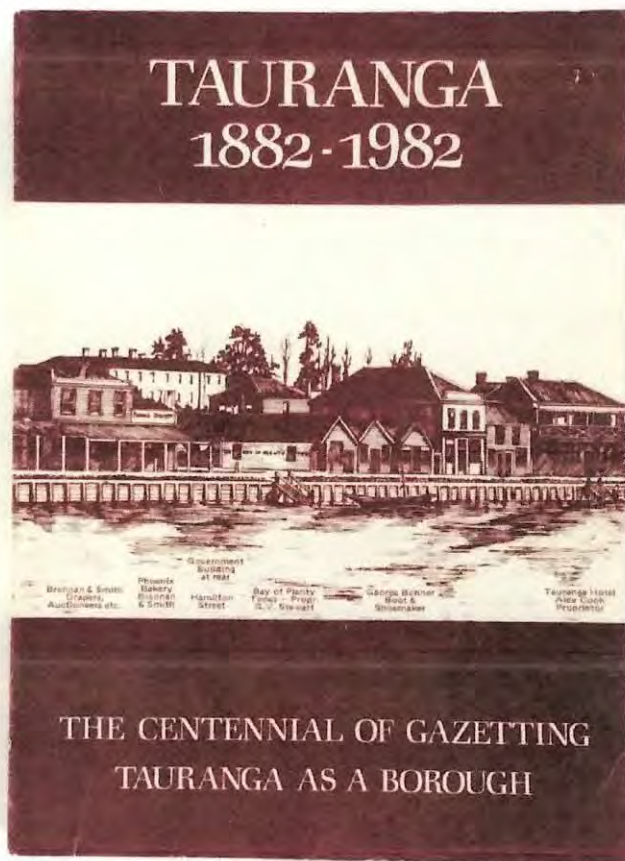

John Robert Godley (29 May 1814 – 17 November 1861) was an Anglo-Irish statesman and bureaucrat. Godley is considered to be the founder of Canterbury, New Zealand, although he lived there for only two years.

Early life

Godley was born in Dublin, the eldest son of John Godley and Katherine Daly. His father was an Anglo-Irish landlord with country estates in County Leitrim and County Meath in Ireland. He was educated at Harrow School and Christ Church, Oxford, graduating in classics in 1836. He was always very sickly, which prevented him from pursuing a chosen career in law.

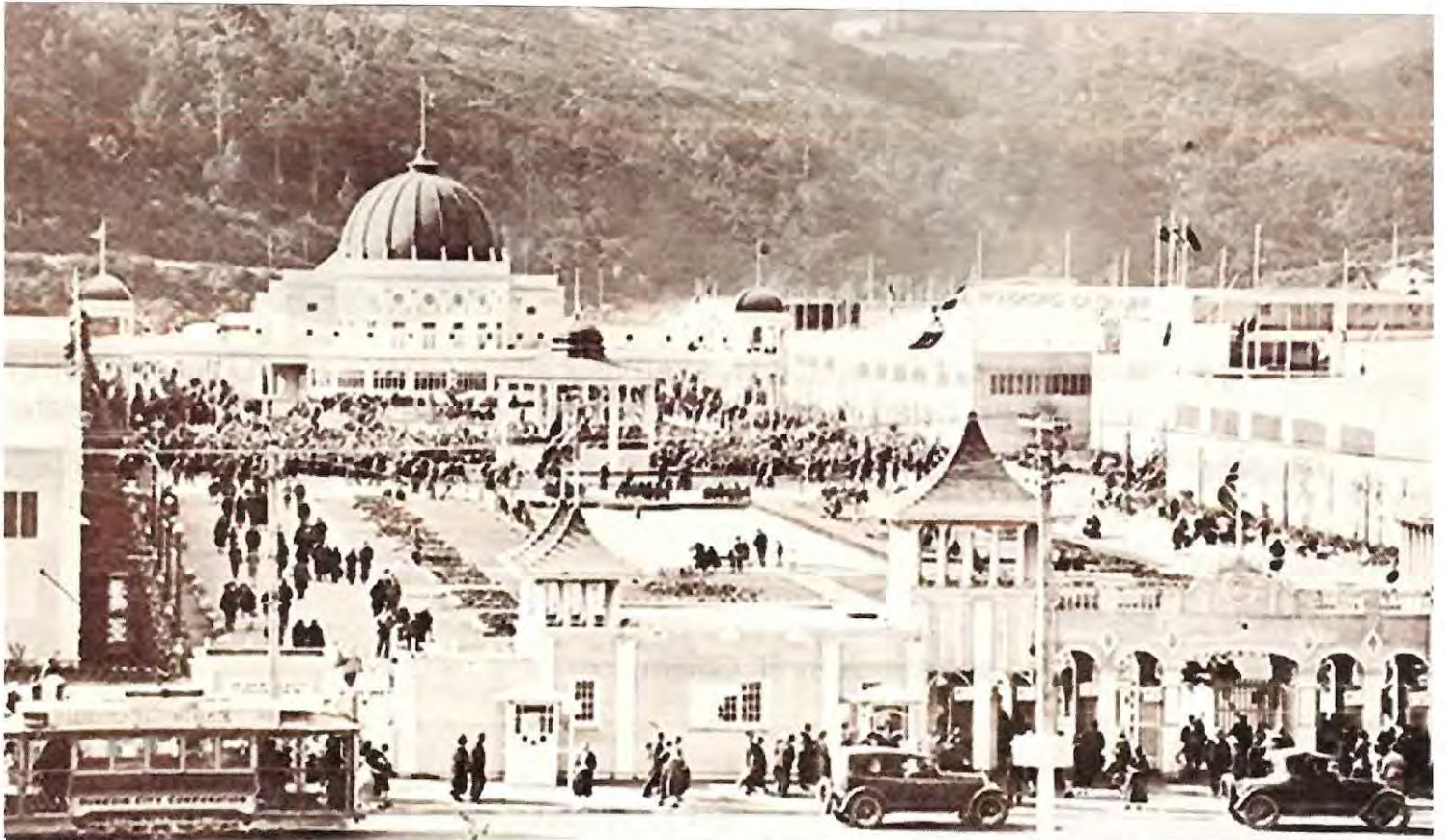

New Zealand and South Seas Exhibition, 1925–26 (1st of 3)1075



Governor-General Sir Charles Fergusson opened Dunedin's New Zealand and South Seas International Exhibition in November 1925. By the time the exhibition closed in May 1926, it had attracted over 3.2 million visitors, more than double New Zealand's total population at the time.

Promoted by the Otago Expansion League in response to the population and economic drift north, the exhibition site was on reclaimed land at Lake Logan, near the University of Otago.

Architect Edmund Anscombe designed seven pavilions linked by covered walkways around a grand court of reflecting pools leading to the domed Festival Hall. The buildings occupied approximately 16 acres (6½ ha). There was an art gallery, a fernery (with a waterfall and streams), and an amusement area with seven major rides and a fun factory featuring a large comic-face entrance.

It appears southerners never tired of the exhibition during the 24 weeks it was running – the closing Saturday had a record attendance of 83,935. It would be a long wait for the next exhibition on a similar scale: the Centennial Exhibition held in Wellington in 1939–40

Colony of New Zealand

The **Colony of New Zealand** was a British colony that existed in New Zealand from 1841 to 1907, created as a Crown colony. The power of the British Government was vested in the governor of New Zealand, but the colony was granted self-government in 1852. The New Zealand Constitution Act 1852 was passed and the first parliament was elected in 1853; the first responsible government was formed in 1856. The Colony of New Zealand had three capitals: Old Russell (1841), Auckland (1841–1865), and **** Wellington** (after 1865). In 1907, the colony became the Dominion of New Zealand with a more explicit recognition of self-government within the British Empire.

Self-governing colony

As new European settlements were founded in the colony, demands for self-government became louder. The New Zealand Company settlement of Port Nicholson **** (Wellington)** had its own elected council, which was forcibly dissolved by Lieutenant-Governor William Hobson in 1840. Later, Wellington became the centre of agitation by settlers for representative government led by Samuel Revans, who founded the Wellington Settlers' Constitutional Association in 1848.

The first New Zealand Constitution Act was passed in 1846, though Governor George Grey was opposed to provisions that would divide the country into European and Māori districts. As a result, almost all of the Act was suspended for six years pending a new Act of 1852, with the only operative part of the 1846 Act being the creation of New Zealand's first provinces. In the meantime, Grey drafted his own Act which established both provincial and central representative assemblies, and allowed for Māori districts and an elected governor. The latter proposal was rejected by the Parliament of the United Kingdom when it adopted Grey's constitution.

Cape Reinga Lighthouse is a lighthouse at Cape Reinga in the Northland Region of the North Island of New Zealand. It is owned and operated by Maritime New Zealand. The lighthouse is a common New Zealand icon and a popular tourist destination although the lighthouse itself is not open to the public.

The lighthouse was built in 1941 and first lit during May of that year. It was the last manned light to be built in New Zealand and replaced the Cape Maria Van Diemen Lighthouse, located on nearby Motuopao Island, which had been built in 1879. Accessing that lighthouse was difficult due to the rough seas in the area, so in 1938, it was decided to move the lighthouse to Cape Reinga for safety reasons. The complete lantern fittings from Motuopao Island were reused at Cape Reinga, though the new lighthouse was fitted with a 1000 watt electrical lamp instead that could be seen for 26 nautical miles (48 km). The lamp was powered by a diesel generator.

In 1987, the lighthouse was fully automated and the lighthouse keepers were withdrawn. The lighthouse is now monitored remotely from Wellington. In May 2000 the original lens and lamp were replaced by a 50 watt beacon. The beacon is powered by batteries that are recharged by solar cells. The beacon flashes every 12 seconds and can be seen for 19 nautical miles (35 km).

Skycity Auckland (stylised as SkyCity Auckland) is an entertainment complex in the central business district of Auckland, New Zealand, between Victoria and Federal Streets. Located at the base of the Sky Tower, it was the second casino in New Zealand, and is still the only casino in Auckland.

Facilities

In addition to the Sky Tower, the complex includes a 700-seat theatre, bars and restaurants, and three hotels, one of which will be opening in 2021. The complex also has a casino that was last refurbished in 2006, with over 1,600 gambling machines, and over 100 gambling tables. The casino also has special rooms for VIP / high-stakes gamblers.

In September 2013, it was announced that Skycity Auckland had purchased a 21m motor yacht "Horizon II" for corporate entertainment.

In February 2018, Skycity Auckland opened New Zealand's first purpose-built e-sports broadcasting studio, located on Level 2 of the Sky Tower.

History

The Sky Tower, convention centre and hotel were all built by Fletcher Construction and completed by 1997.

Skycity's casino was the second casino in the country. At the time of its construction, it was controversial, just like the Sky Tower itself. Unlike the city's icon towering above it, major figures like former Auckland Mayor Dick Hubbard have remained critical of the casino, though he acknowledged that the complex itself has been positive for the city. However, there is criticism from various sources that the casino creates problem gambling and does not ban problem gamblers proactively enough.

The casino provides almost 2000 jobs and has returned NZD \$670 million in dividends to mainly Australian shareholders, from more than eight million visitors that have passed through, 15% from overseas. NZD \$18.6 million was also paid to community organisations and trusts in the same time. 1.5% of the operating profit has to

be paid out to charity according to law.

New Zealand Exhibition

1865 Dunedin 1101

The **New Zealand Exhibition** held in Dunedin, New Zealand, in 1865 was a world's fair visited by 31250 people. It was the first world's fair held in New Zealand. It opened on 12 January and ran until 6 May 1865.

Organisation

Following the Bazaar and Industrial Exhibition of 1862, held in Dunedin, a group of gentlemen formed a committee for the promotion of a similar exhibition to be held on a larger scale in Dunedin in 1865. An application was made in February 1863 to the Governor requesting the formation of a Royal Commission, which was granted in May. The Provincial Government provided the sum of £4,000 for the aid of general purposes and another £4,000 to build a suitable building. John Hyde Harris was president of the executive, James Hector was commissioner and juror, Alfred Eccles the secretary and Thomas Forrester building superintendent.

Architecture

A low-level site on King Street was secured and a contract was let to Messrs. George Cornwell and Edward Horsman on November 11, 1863 for £10,250 to erect the Main Building. There was a large two-story stone Italianate building with clock tower and a series of annexes all designed by Mason and Clayton, with a central courtyard derived from Fowler's design of Covent Garden market. It was not completely finished when the fair opened.

International Participation

From the America came exhibits from Canada and the United States. From Europe came exhibits from Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Great Britain, and the Netherlands. The sole Asian exhibiting nation was that of India. From Oceania, the colonies of New Zealand were well represented as were New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, and Victoria. Altogether there came 1,598 exhibits from about 700 exhibitors.

Legacy

Exhibits from the exhibition provided the opening collection of the colonial museum, and added to the collection at the Otago Museum, and the main building was converted into a new hospital for Dunedin. The old annex at the rear of the building was torn down in the mid-1890s, and a fire in the tower in 1897 almost destroyed the entire building. The old exhibition hospital finally was torn down in 1933.

After the exhibition, the collections were put into store and the art works were included in formation of Otago Society of Arts in 1876.

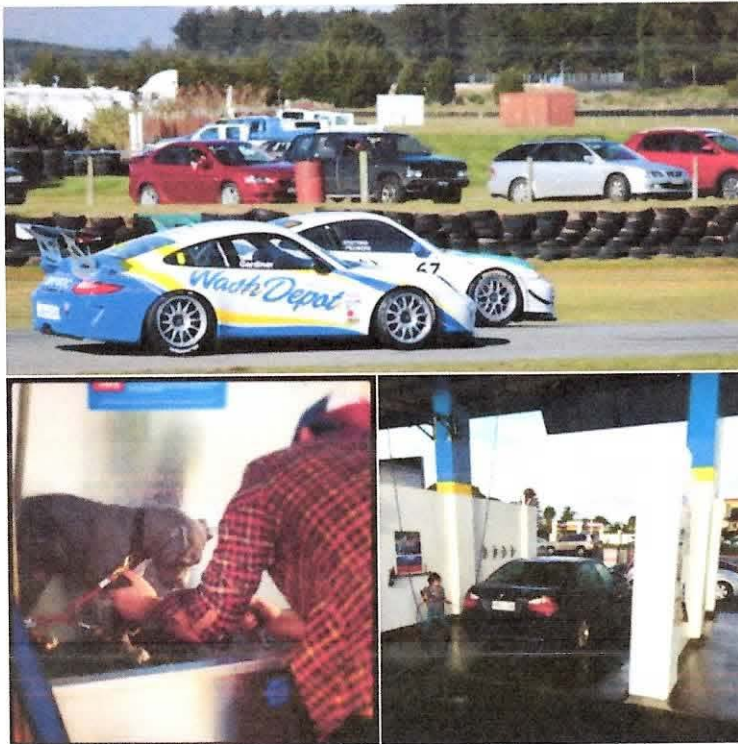

Following the massacre of Israeli athletes at the 1972 Munich Olympics, the X Games at Christchurch was the first multi-sport event to place the safety of participants and spectators as its uppermost requirement. Security guards surrounded the athlete's village and there was an exceptionally high-profile police presence. Even so, Christchurch enchanted the watching world as a city of beauty.

The entire immediate British Royal Family (Elizabeth II, her husband and children) visited New Zealand as a group and the Royal Yacht Britannia was the royal residence during the Games. The opening ceremony was held in the mid afternoon, with Prince Philip as the attending royal. The athletes took the oath and Sylvia Potts, the runner who fell mere metres from a gold medal finish in the 1970 Games, entered the stadium with the Queen's Baton. It was presented to Prince Philip who read the message from the Queen declaring the 1974 Christchurch 10th British Commonwealth Games open.

Only 22 countries succeeded in winning medals from the total haul of 374 medals on offer, but first time winners included Western Samoa, Lesotho and Swaziland.

On the running track, Jamaica's Don Quarrie successfully defended both his 1970 100m and 200m gold medals. Quarrie was to go on to win the 1978 100m as well. Filbert Bayi of Tanzania beat John Walker of New Zealand and Ben Jipcho of Kenya to win the 1500 metres and set a new World Record.

Nine sports were featured in these Games with 1,276 athletes taking part in athletics, badminton, boxing, cycling, lawn bowls, shooting, swimming and diving, weightlifting and wrestling.

The Games were an important milestone in New Zealand television, marking the introduction of colour television. However, due to the NZBC's limited colour facilities, only athletics, swimming, and boxing could be broadcast in colour.

During the 1970s and 1980s there was a major questioning of New Zealand identity. The belief in material progress, the British heritage, the benign role of government and the idealisation of the heroic male pioneer – all of which had loomed large in 1940 – was being challenged. Immigration had made the population more diverse and, above all, there was a strident Māori protest movement which focused on the failure of the government to live up to the Treaty of Waitangi.

The future not the past

The sesquicentennial (150th anniversary) of New Zealand in 1990 featured little celebratory self-satisfaction and praise of the pioneers. Michael Bassett, the government minister responsible, insisted that ‘commemoration’ not ‘celebration’ be the focus. The only re-enactments were of the landing of the settlers at Petone Beach and a replay of the debate about the Treaty at Waitangi before it was signed (with actor Bruno Lawrence starring as missionary William Colenso).

Many anniversaries (There were two major events.)

Unlike the 1940 centenary, the anniversaries of British settlement or sovereignty were not remembered. Rather, the anniversary of the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi took centre stage. However, fearing Māori protest, Bassett and the 1990 Commission which he appointed to oversee the commemoration diluted the issue by emphasising other anniversaries, some of which were debatable. Besides the treaty they included:

The Commonwealth Games in Auckland

The games opened on 24 January with a spectacular multimedia performance representing the migration to Aotearoa of waves of peoples – Māori, British settlers, and then other diverse groups.

Waitangi Day

There was a day of commemoration at Waitangi on 6 February. Two special 1990 projects – 20 waka taua (war canoes) and visiting tall sailing ships – were present to greet Queen Elizabeth II when she arrived on a launch, reinforcing the message that all New Zealanders were migrant peoples.

The queen was escorted to the shore by the waka followed by outrigger canoes from the Pacific communities. There was considerable protest. The queen flinched when a black T-shirt was thrown close to her, and most of the speeches were drowned out – except for challenging words from Whakahuihui Vercoe, Anglican bishop of Aotearoa. But there was no violence and the hot afternoon saw dance, music and drama from the country’s multicultural communities – ranging from the City of Wellington pipe band and the Lochiel marching team to the Cook Islands national ensemble.

AUCKLAND INDUSTRIAL AND MINING EXHIBITION 1898-1899.

1st. December 1898 to 28th. February 1899

A world fair was held in 1898 in Auckland's Domain, in the heart of the city. The Auckland Industrial and Mining Exhibition opened on 1st December 1898. The industrial courts were described in an Australian newspaper (the Inquirer & Commercial News (Perth, WA), Friday 9 December 1898, p.2) at the time as a 'credit to the colony, the exhibits of mineral and woollen goods being particularly fine'.



THE PRINCES STREET FRONT OF THE AUCKLAND EXHIBITION BUILDING.

The buildings of the exhibition covered a large area of about 5 acres on part of what was the Old Government House grounds. The main entrance to the building was in Princes Street. The exhibition was divided into six sections — industries, products, machinery, mining and minerals, art and music, athletic sports, and competitions.

A great number of dignitaries attended including Lord Ranfurly, the Governor and the Mayors of Auckland, Onehunga, Thames, New Plymouth and Nelson. A choir of 209 voices sang the National Anthem to welcome the entrance of the dignitaries (Taranaki Herald, Volume XLVII, Issue 11389, 2 December 1898, Page 2).

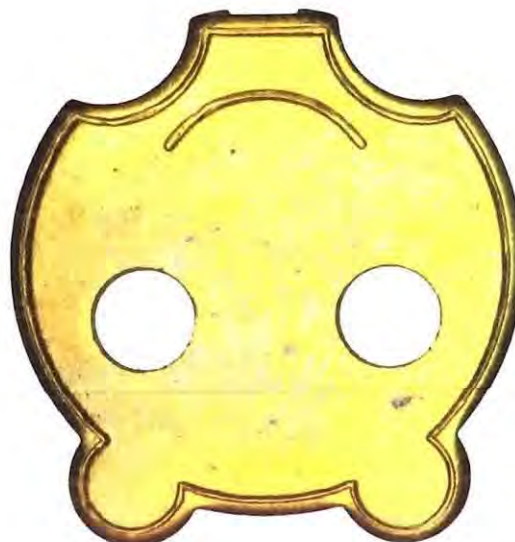

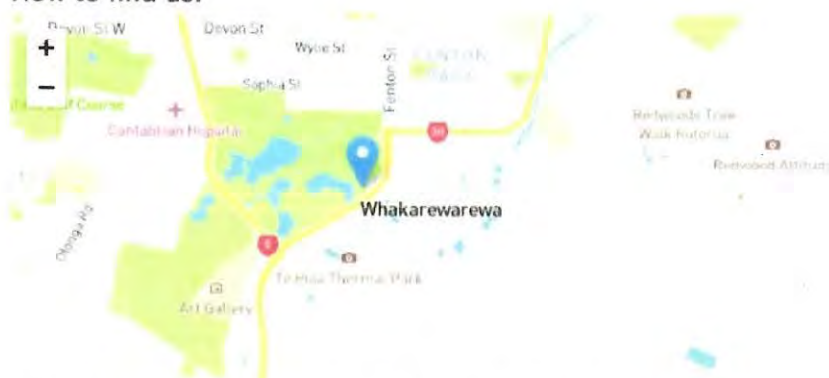

Rotorua

Rotorua [ˌrɒtɔːˈruːə] (Māori: *Te Rotorua-nui-a-Kahumatamomoe*) is a city on the southern shores of Lake Rotorua from which the city takes its name, in the Bay of Plenty Region of New Zealand's North Island. It is the seat of the Rotorua Lakes District, a territorial authority encompassing Rotorua and several other nearby towns. Rotorua has an estimated resident population of 58,500, making it the country's 12th largest urban area, and the Bay of Plenty's second largest urban area behind Tauranga.

Rotorua is a major destination for both domestic and international tourists; the tourism industry is by far the largest industry in the district. It is known for its geothermal activity, and features geysers – notably the Pohutu Geyser at Whakarewarewa – and hot mud pools. This thermal activity is sourced to the Rotorua caldera, in which the town lies. Rotorua is home to the Toi Ohomai Institute of Technology.

History

The name Rotorua comes from Māori, the full name for the city and lake is **Te Rotorua-nui-a-Kahumatamomoe**. *Roto* means 'lake' and *rua* means 'two' or in this case 'second' – Rotorua thus meaning 'Second lake'. Kahumatamomoe was the uncle of the Māori chief Ihenga, the ancestral explorer of the Te Arawa. It was the second major lake the chief discovered, and he dedicated it to his uncle. It is the largest of a multitude of lakes found to the northeast, all connected with the Rotorua Caldera and nearby Mount Tarawera. The name can also mean the equally appropriate 'Crater lake'.

The area was initially settled by Māori of the Te Arawa Iwi in the 14th century. During the early 1820s Ngapuhi led by chief Hongi Hika launched a series of raids into the Bay of Plenty as a part of the Musket Wars, in 1823 a Ngapuhi raiding party led by Hongi Hika attacked Te Arawa at their Pa (Fortified settlement) on Mokoia Island defeating them. The first European

in the area was probably Phillip Tapsell who was trading from the Bay of Plenty coast at Maketu from 1828. He later married into Te Arawa and became highly regarded by them. Missionaries Henry Williams and Thomas Chapman visited in 1831 and Chapman and his wife established a mission at Te Koutu in 1835. This was abandoned within a year but Chapman returned in 1838 and established a second mission at Mokoia Island.

The lakeshore was a prominent site of skirmishes during the New Zealand Wars of the 1860s. A "special town district" was created in 1883, to promote Rotorua's potential as a spa destination. The town was connected to Auckland with the opening of the Rotorua Branch railway and commencement of the Rotorua Express train in 1894, resulting in the rapid growth of the town and tourism from this time forward. Rotorua was established as a borough in 1922, elected its first mayor in 1923, and declared a city in 1962 before becoming a district in 1979.

Moller & Sons, Dunedin were the successful tenderer for the striking of commemorative medallions for Dominion Day. The tender called for 170,000 pieces which were to be distributed to school children on 1st anniversary 26th September, 1908 of the Dominion Day Declaration. The medals, it is recorded, were struck at the rate of 4,000 per day at the cost of 1 penny each.

THE DOMINION SCHOOL MEDALS.

The order received by Messrs Moller and Sons, of this city, for the supply of 180,000 medals to commemorate the proclamation of New Zealand as a Dominion, is generally regarded as being the largest order of the kind yet submitted to any single firm in the Dominion, and as they will shortly be ready for distribution amongst the school children throughout New Zealand, some further particulars concerning the medal will doubtless prove of interest.

The medal itself is slightly larger than a halfpenny, and bears on its obverse a circle enclosing the King's head surmounted by the royal crown, and flanked on each side with the New Zealand and British ensigns, and bears the inscription, "Edward VII of the British Dominions, King." The reverse is ornamented with crossed fern-fronds in relief, inscribed, "Presented to the children attending the schools of the Dominion." Surrounding it are the words, "New Zealand proclaimed a Dominion, September 26, 1907."

The metal is an alloy of aluminium and magnesium, invented by Dr Mach, and is manufactured in Westphalia. It is quite the latest of its kind, being practically unknown in commercial circles as yet, and is a white metal resembling silver. Light as aluminium is known to be, magnalium is even a trifle lighter, its density being 2.4 to 2.57, whereas the density of aluminium is 2.67.

SCHOOL MEDALS.

OTAGO WITNESS,
10 JUNE 1908,

On 26 September 1907 the colony of New Zealand ceased to exist. New Zealand became a Dominion within the British Empire. A step towards becoming an Independent Nation. For a few years some New Zealanders celebrated 'Dominion Day' on 26 September with parades and public events. Some banks and law firms closed, with a few keeping up the tradition until the 1950s. Various groups brought the word 'dominion' into their titles. In Wellington, the Dominion newspaper began to be published.

The first Dominion Day in 1907 was a holiday for public servants. All government offices closed to mark the occasion. An aluminium Dominion Day medal was struck for every school child in New Zealand.

As the Dominion's Capital, Wellington put on a big show all day and into the evening on 26 September. In the middle of the morning, a Guard of Honour marched from the Mount Cook Barracks to Parliament House. The Garrison Band played lively marching tunes, and some people had erected streamers and emblems of New Zealand in their windows.

Proclamation of Dominion Status

At 11 am on the steps of Parliament the governor of the time, invited the Prime Minister to read the proclamation of dominion status. He did so, and shouted out, 'Three cheers for the King' (the response was 'hearty and unanimous', according to the Evening Post). This was followed by cheers for the governor, Prime Minister, and the new Dominion of New Zealand.

The military and the school cadets paraded, and Maori performed a haka. It was all over in just 15 minutes. The crowd, which was not large, set off for Newtown Park where it watched a military review featuring 1600 men. The governor inspected the troops, and more speeches were made. Dignitaries had lunch at Government House.

Omaka Aerodrome

Omaka Aerodrome (ICAO: **NZOM**) is a New Zealand private airfield owned by the Marlborough Aero Club and used solely by private and vintage aircraft.

Located two nautical miles to the Southwest of Blenheim, New Zealand at the northern end of the South Island.

It houses the Omaka Aviation Heritage Centre, established in 2006, which displays many vintage aircraft.

Since 2001 the Classic Fighters biennial airshow has taken place at Omaka. It is held on the Easter weekend of odd-numbered years. each show is based on a different theme and typically includes mock air battles and other displays.

Omaka Airpark

Managed by the Omaka Aviation Heritage Centre and located adjacent to this iconic museum, is the Omaka Airpark. With space on the airfield at a premium, this development is providing new opportunities for business and private ownership alike.

Provision has been made for fully serviced sites, providing three-phase power, water and sewerage to each boundary. A one off contribution towards installation is payable on securing a site.

A 30m wide taxiway provides access onto Omaka Aerodrome.

Sites are reserved for aviation related activities

Prospective hangar owners must join the Marlborough Aero Club, in order to cover their use of the airfield.

Sites are sub-leased from The New Zealand Aviation Museum Trust (trading as the Omaka Aviation Heritage Centre). Full details of lease terms and rates are available on request.

Cecil Walkden Wood (28 March 1874 – 1965) was a New Zealand engineer from Timaru who made New Zealand's first motorcycle in 1901 and second known indigenous car in 1902. He also provided an engine to Richard Pearse for his airplane.

Early life

Wood was born in Timaru on 28 March 1874, the son of Charles Walkden Wood. Educated in Lyttelton. He married Edith Susan Harris in September 1899 and they had one son. He first worked as a mechanical engineer at Lyttelton, and then became involved in the cycle trade in Christchurch.

In 1894 he started his Timaru business, C W Wood and Co. It was the first cycle shop in Timaru. Wood opened his Tourist Cycle Factory in Timaru in 1896. Wood's was noted in 1897 being interested in motor vehicles, but there was no early reference to him constructing any engines or vehicles at that time. The local papers mentioned several bicycles he constructed including a tandem, but none were motorised. The first press report of any of Woods machines was in May 1900. It was a chainless bicycle owned by a Raymond of Timaru. The bicycle was made at the Tourist Workshop.

In July 1900 the Tourist Cycle Factory moved to a new premises. Possibly the same workshop in front of which Wood's was later photographed on his motor tricycle. By 1903 Wood was manufacturing motor cars, two of which were running about the streets of Timaru. The coachwork for his second and third vehicles was by wheelwright and coach builder John James Grandi, a partner in Tourist Cycle Factory. By September 1903 Woods was bankrupt.

Wood is credited with making New Zealand's first indigenous motor car in some publications on 22 November 1897, but current evidence has Frederick Dennison making the first car in June 1900. Wood's first confirmed motor vehicle, a three-wheeler, was built between 1900 when Dennison saw it under construction and 4 June 1901 when it was reported running. There is a question as to whether the June date is correct because the first Wood constructed three wheeler was only reported in the Timaru paper in December 1902 and the first known Wood engine was shown to the public on 29 July 1901. Wood stated in July 1901 that he intended to connect a new motor to a bicycle at some date in the future.

An Ashburton newspaper published an article in November 1901 stated that C T Jessop and Co of Temuka had made New Zealand's first motor-cycle, which could be correct. Wood is known to have completed constructed a motor-cycle shortly afterwards in December 1901. The engine on this first machine was constructed by Wood, but later machines used imported *Minerva* engines.

Later life

In 1904 Wood became manager of Scott's cycle store in Stafford Street, Timaru. By 1905 he was selling Scott steam cars as well as bicycles.

Wood died in 1965 aged 91.

New Zealand Federation of Labour (1909)

The **New Zealand Federation of Labour**, also known as *The Red Federation* and *The United Federation of Labour*, was a New Zealand federation of syndicalist trade unions which was formalised in 1909. The federation is best known for its involvement in the nation-wide Great Strike of 1913 which almost brought New Zealand's economy to a halt. The Federation's members were often referred to as 'Red Feds'.

Origin

The federation was originally formed as the *New Zealand Federation of Miners* in 1908 after a strike of coal miners in Greymouth. The strike was largely in opposition to an arbitration act by government which meant that industrial disputes had to be settled in a special court. In 1909 the federation was renamed to the New Zealand Federation of Labour. The Federation was inspired by American union federations including the Industrial Workers of the World.

Prominent leaders included Bob Semple who in 1935 became Minister of Public Works with the first Labour Government.

1913 General Strike

The Federation lead a near-general strike in 1913. The industrial action began after two dispute took place: one in Wellington where waterside workers demanded better pay, and one in Huntly. The strikes spread all over the country and lasted until early 1914.

Defeat and legacy

The Federation was defeated during the Great Strike. Many prominent leaders of the federation, and other socialist organisations, formed the Labour party in 1916.

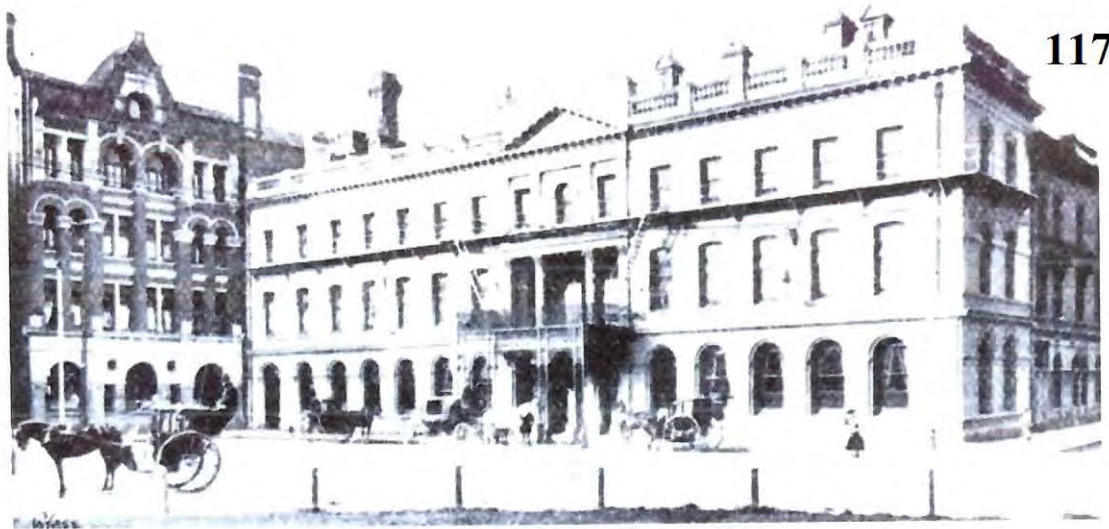

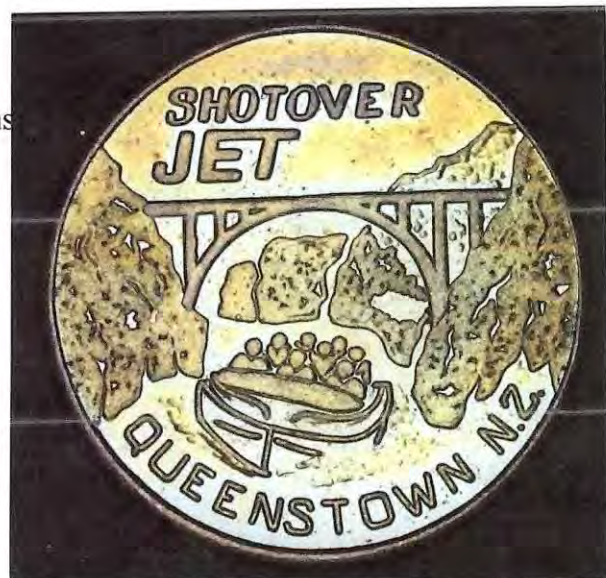

The **1988 Summer Olympics** (Korean: 1988년 하계 올림픽; RR: *1988nyeon Hagye Ollimpig*), officially known as the **Games of the XXIV Olympiad** (Korean: 제24회 올림픽경기대회; RR: *Je 24hoe Ollimpiggyeong-gidaehoe*) and commonly known as **Seoul 1988** (Korean: 서울 1988), was an international multi-sport event held from 17 September to 2 October 1988 in Seoul, South Korea. 159 nations were represented at the games by a total of 8,391 athletes (6,197 men and 2,194 women). 237 events were held and 27,221 volunteers helped to prepare the Olympics.

The 1988 Seoul Olympics were the second summer Olympic Games held in Asia. South Korea ranked fourth overall, winning 12 gold medals and 33 medals in the competition. 11,331 media (4,978 written press and 6,353 broadcasters) showed the Games all over the world. These were the last Olympic Games of the Cold War, as well as for the Soviet Union and East Germany, as both ceased to exist before the next Olympic Games in 1992. The Soviet Union dominated the medal count, winning 55 gold and 132 total medals. No nation has repeated this result since 1988.

Compared to the 1980 Summer Olympics (Moscow) and the 1984 Summer Olympics (Los Angeles), which were divided into two camps by ideology, the 1988 Seoul Olympics was a competition in which the boycotts virtually disappeared, although they were not completely over. North Korea boycotted the 1988 Seoul Olympics, as well as five socialist countries including Cuba, an ally of North Korea. Albania, Ethiopia, and Seychelles did not respond to the invitation sent by the IOC.

Nicaragua did not participate due to athletic and financial considerations. The participation of Madagascar had been expected, and their team was expected at the opening ceremony of 160 nations; however, the country withdrew for financial reasons. Nonetheless, the much larger boycotts seen in the 1976, 1980 and 1984 Olympics were avoided, resulting in the largest number of participating nations during the Cold War era. Olympic boycotts ended completely at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics four years later.

Auckland Licensed Victuallers Association, Auckland, New Zealand

The Auckland Licensed Victuallers Association issued penny tokens celebrating the formation of their organisation in 1871, and provided coins for giving change to hotel patrons in the city. According to a report quoted by numismatist H.A. Robinson, up to fifty per cent of copper coins in circulation in New Zealand at that time were trade tokens, a response to a deep shortage of official currency in the country. Robinson's research found that in 1873 the Licensed Victuallers 'used to meet at the British Hotel, corner of Queen and Durham Streets, where the Auckland Power Board building now stands.'

The New Zealand Licensed Victuallers Association, of which the Auckland association was a part, joined the Hospitality Association of New Zealand in the late twentieth century. For further details, see the history section of the Association's website.

Birmingham medalist and mint-owner Joseph Moore is thought to have struck the association's tokens in 1871.

Wellington Harbour Board

The **Wellington Harbour Board** was constituted by act of parliament which took effect on 1 January 1880. Shipowners, those paying harbour dues, Wellington City, Hutt County, Wairarapa County, and Wellington's Chamber of Commerce all elected representatives to the board. The Mayor of Wellington was a member as was one further direct government appointment.

In October 1988 obliged by central government's unexpected resort to the High Court the business of the port was taken over from the Board by a conventional commercial enterprise, also named Port of Wellington Limited. The Lambton Harbour Project begun in 1985 hiving off and developing the Board's waterfront property in conjunction with the Wellington City Council and the Board's own self-corporatisation in mid-1987 were made obsolete.

The Board's own decisions had been overtaken by the central government's restructuring of its own and local government activities. For ports these were set out in the Ports Reform Act of April 1988 and they were given effect in Wellington the following October.

After realising its substantial remaining assets accumulated over almost 110 years the proceeds were divided between the district councils now representing Wellington, Hutt, Wairarapa and Manawatu and the Wellington Harbour Board's life ended through the 1989 local government reforms on 31 October of that year.

NEDERLAND LINE "BOORDGELD"

by F. K. Gottermeyer

A series of tokens used as "ship's money" were circulated in bygone years aboard ships of the Stoomvaart Mij "Nederland" (SMN). A shortage of overseas funds immediately after the second World War forced the Dutch Government to impose exchange control regulations. Dutch people who wanted to travel overseas had to obtain permission from the Nederland Bank to buy overseas currency, and such permission was generally limited to about £10 sterling per journey. When commercial marine activities resumed, several Dutch shipping companies, including SMN, introduced a system of coupons to part overcome the restriction of not being able to take Dutch money overseas.

Drink coupons were printed in values of 10 and 25 cents. Passengers obtained these coupons at the start of each trip on presentation of their currency permit and used them to make bar purchases during the voyage. Although the system worked, it was very cumbersome, especially the accounting check at the conclusion of

each round trip when SMN stewards had the task of physically counting a mountain of coupons usually between 280,000 and 700,000 which represented a 70,000 guilder typical bar turnover for a passenger ship such as the "Oranje".

An employee (whose name was unrecorded) came up with the suggestion of replacing coupons with reusable tokens. These tokens proved so successful that they stayed in circulation long after the original currency control restrictions were lifted. As no special designer was commissioned it is assumed the size and design were determined by consultation between SMN Management and Dutch State Mint Officials. The Company initially had considerable difficulty persuading the "Rijksmunt" (Dutch State Mint) to accept the "boordgeld" order. Never before had this august institution accepted a private firm's coin order. Officials were also concerned that the tokens would find circulation ashore. Hence the name "boordgeld", board money, was to be used aboard ship.

Stoomvaart Maatschappij Nederland

Most were struck in 1947. After the second world war, the gulden was not convertible and the economy was in a shambles. Unemployment was quite high. Many chose to emigrate, rather than wait for things to get better. Emigration countries were mostly Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Netherlands Antilles and Surinam.

MSN had regular services to most of these countries and what is now Indonesia, which became unsafe quickly. They could not accept Dutch currency on board, as it was not allowed to import or export Dutch money, but they did want people to spend money on board. These tokens could be bought before boarding and spent on the ships. Values are 5, 10, 25 (Round), 25 (Square), 50 cents, 1, 2-1/2 gulden. A 5 gulden piece was added in 1948.

Denominations were decided on by the Company's Financial Department. Metal selection was based on need to resist corrosion from both sea air (salt spray) and tropical heat. "Boordgeld" was introduced in 1947 and used aboard SMN passenger ships "Johan de Witt", "Johan van Oldenbarnevelt" and "Oranje". However while primary use was aboard these passenger vessels, officer and crew transfers over the years led to extended token use on the SMN freighters with passenger accommodation.

Passengers on SMN ships were of many nationalities and had with them varied currencies — guilders, pounds sterling, dollars, rupees etc. Currencies also came in many forms from bank note to travellers cheques. All these different types of money could be exchanged at the Purser's Offices for "boordgeld". Once passengers made the initial conversion of their respective currency to "boordgeld", all subsequent payments on board ship were simplified. Using the ship's money meant that only one currency was in use during the voyage. As it suited both passenger and crew "boordgeld" was accepted as "legal tender" aboard ship and proved a tremendous success during some 17 years of official circulation: Typical usage was extended from the original bar use, to pay for travellers' everyday needs including toiletries, barber, photographer etc. Tokens left over at the conclusion of the voyage were often given away as tips to the stewards or kept as souvenirs.

Although SMN never had intention of making profit out of "boordgeld" it did turn out a profitable venture for the company. Offsetting the original high minting costs was the high number of tokens never redeemed, lost overboard and elsewhere or taken home as souvenirs by departing passengers. It became general knowledge that the original round 25 cent token fitted certain American slot vending machines. This resulted in its early and prompt withdrawal and replacement by a square token.

"Boordgeld" were withdrawn in 1964 when SMN's last passenger ship was sold. However some tokens continued in use for a period beyond the official 17 years on board company freighters. The tokens gradually acquired collectors' value and usage eventually ceased as they all but disappeared through souveniring.

In 1970 Stoomvaart Mij "Nederland" amalgamated with several other Dutch Shipping Lines (Rotterdam Lloyd, Royal Interocean Lines and others) to form the Netherlands Shipping Union (Nedlloyd Group). Official Nedlloyd demonetization took place in 1976. At this time staff of the Nedlloyd Group were given the opportunity to obtain one set each of "boordgeld" free, prior to scrapping tokens. Orders had to be in by December and the assembled sets collected in person or by delegate from the porter of Netherlands Shipping Union headquarters, Rijswijk, during February and March 1977. About 1000 sets were distributed to staff before the balance in stock was destroyed. Additional to these sets an unknown number of tokens, particularly the lower denominations were kept by crew and former passengers as souvenirs. Records on quantities of "boordgeld" minted remain untraced.

Denominations were 5, 10, 25, 50, 100, 250, and 500 cents equivalent to Dutch currency. (No token has the same diameter of any Dutch coin.) The two lowest denominations were struck in bronze and are round. Aluminium was used for the 25, 50, 100 and 250 cent tokens. The withdrawn round 25 cent piece was replaced by a square token with rounded corners measuring 25.4 mm diagonally. This token has been turned 45° to be viewed in "diamond" rather than square. The three other aluminium tokens are round and have diameters of 26, 31 and 38 mm for the 50, 100 and 250 respectively.

The 500 piece is also round but differs from the other tokens by being twin metal. A 32 mm round aluminium central section has been inserted inside a 6 mm wide bronze outer ring giving the two metal tokens a 38 mm diameter and size equal to the aluminium 250 cent piece. The token weight however is noticeably different and token readily identifiable.

The obverse of all eight tokens features on a plain field within a raised outer rim the then commonly used SMN company symbol. The initials SMN in three large block letters: S (over) M (over) N, all enclosed between two "V" shaped brackets. The centrally placed squat M has three wavy lines representing the sea to both its left and right in the area of the "V" bracket apex. (See illustration no. 6.) S M N are the initials for Stoomvaart Mij "Nederland".

Equally spaced at approximately 2 mm and 4 mm from the outer rim are two circular ridges, additional features of the 500 cents outer bronze ring. The Company SMN symbol is disproportionately smaller in comparison with the other tokens. (See illustration No. 7.) The "boordgeld" reverse sides also have a plain field and lettering in relief. The value is in large figures, about quarter of token area, and located on the lower half just below the central line with BOORDGELD horizontally above the figure value. Part of the circumscription located at the token base is a carved AMSTERDAM separated from the balance of the legend by a fivepointed star to either side for the 10, 50, 100, 250 and 500 values. A dot replaces the star(s) on the 5 cent and the star is only fourpointed on the square 25-cent token.

AMSTERDAM is not curved on the 25 as it follows the straight edges; however at the "E" it is bent through 90° to give the word a "V" shape. With the exception of the square 25 cent the rest of the legend follows the outer rim circumference, reading from left to right: — N.V. STOOMV. MIJ., "NEDERLAND" between the stars (or dots). In the case of the 100 value additional inverted commas have been placed at the top of N for NEDERLAND, making it the only token with two sets in this position. N.V. has been omitted from the legend of the square 25-cent token, and only

upper inverted commas are present. STOOMV. MIJ and "NEDERLAND" are both in straight lines following the outer edge.

The twin metal 500-cent piece carries the full legend within the 6 mm bronze outer ring and the inscription BOORDGELD 500 on the aluminium inner core. The Latin device SEMPER * MARE * NAVIGANDUM * (the sea must always be navigated) is incised around the outer edge of the token in block lettering, separating stars being six-pointed. Only the 50, 100, 250 and 500 denominations are incused with the motto. It is of interest that this Latin motto conveniently and not by accident also has the initials SMN. Translated from Dutch to English the token legend reads: — Nederland Steam Navigation Co. Ltd., Amsterdam.
